The 41x133-foot property is in Stonegate, an established pocket of Etobicoke. "It is very transitional. Old homes being torn down and new homes are being built. The demand is very high for this neighbourhood as you are right off of The Queer sway, which is continuing to be built up.


"Transportation is made easy with highways and public transit all around. Proximity to the city is a big attraction for buyers."
